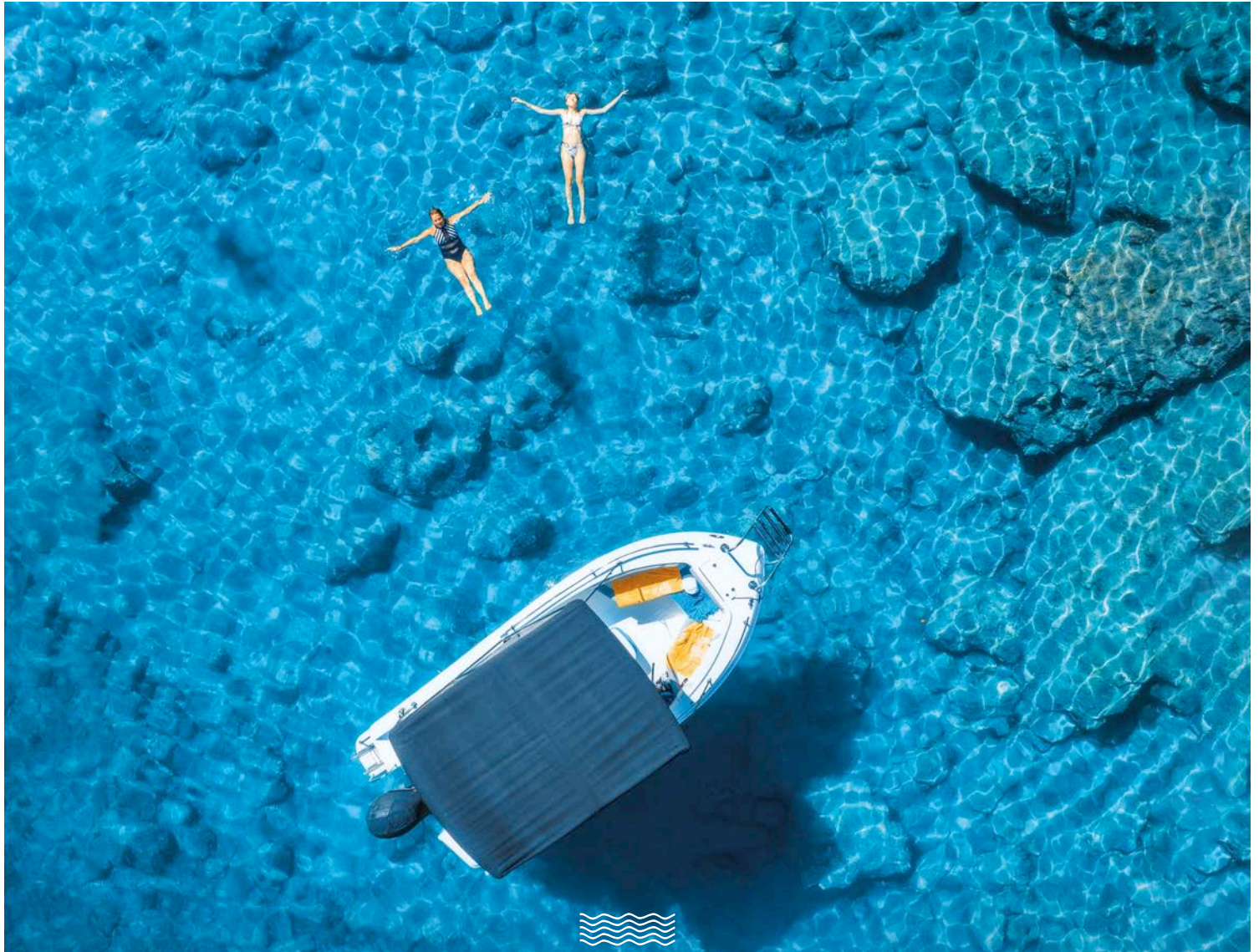

**1** The world of recreational yachting changed when, in **1720**, Irishman **William O'Brien** established the **Water Club of the Harbour of Cork, Ireland**—now called **Royal Cork**. It was the world's first yacht club.



# Setting Sail

RECREATIONAL YACHTING AND THE MILESTONE EVENTS THAT ADDED TO ITS ALLURE.

Recreational sailing has been popular in Singapore since colonial times, inspiring the British to establish the **Singapore Yacht Club in 1826**—it was renamed **Royal Singapore Yacht Club in 1922** after gaining the patronage of the then **Prince of Wales**.

**3** In **1911**, American naval architect and boat builder **John L. Hacker** created **Kitty Hawk**, the first step hydroplane. Hacker's invention was in deference to the Wright brothers, but at **80km/h speed**, **Kitty Hawk** was the **fastest boat then** and its successor models have made race history since.

**4** **CLEOPATRA'S BARGE, BUILT IN MID-1810 WAS THE LARGEST PRIVATE YACHT OF ITS TIME—AND WAS OWNED AND BUILT BY WEALTHY AMERICAN MERCHANT GEORGE CROWNINSHIELD.**



**5** **King Charles II**, the king of Scotland, highly regarded as the **first yachtsman**, is said to have developed a love for sailing from the Dutch while in exile in Holland in the **mid-1600s**. At the end of his decade-long exile, the Dutch presented him with the luxury yacht, **Mary**. It is reported that he built about **20 yachts** throughout his lifetime.

## MARBELLA, SPAIN

Few Mediterranean cities know how to celebrate like Marbella, home to an annual calendar of ferias (fairs) said to rival the show-stopping carnivals in Brazil. The atmosphere makes the Andalusian city an ideal destination for your very own celebration, especially if you have one planned for June, when their week-long Feria de San Bernabé takes place. The iconic feria has been running since 1485, and today, it sports rich cultural processions, art exhibitions, concerts, street performances, and nighttime fireworks.

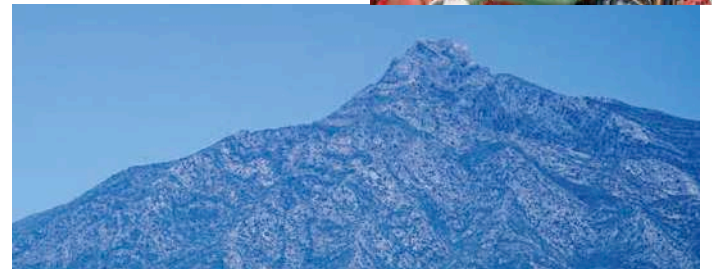
One highlight of the feria is a procession through Marbella's Old Town, so you can immerse yourself in its quaint Renaissance-style buildings.

Marbella is also renowned for its beachfront resorts and villas, should you want to throw a party with your loved ones in a home away from home.

Booking a day out at sea is a must as well, as Marbella's waters are home to three dolphin species that frequent the waters during the spring and the summer. A roster of other fun water sports are available to you and your crew as well, from leisurely paddle boarding to novel flyboarding.

### PLAY

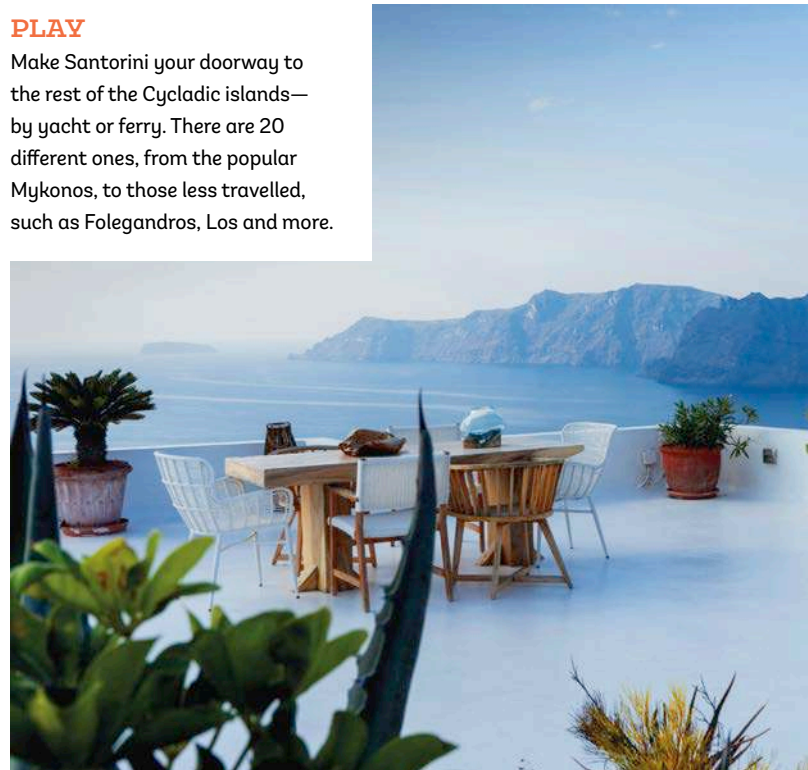
many offering guests the option of booking out the whole restaurant for your event.

You get the full selection of Artemis Karamolegos' wines at the restaurant, best paired with Aroma Avlis' wide array of mezze. Another interesting restaurant to make a reservation at is Panigyri, a restaurant in Fira that offers Greek fare made with ingredients sourced from small Cycladian producers. They are also one of the rare few restaurants with an olive oil sommelier! After all that feasting, book your party a day of pampering at any one of Santorini's hotel spas, or a day out exploring some of its more remote beaches, including Akro Mavro Vouno, famed for its black sand shores.



### PLAY

Make Santorini your doorway to the rest of the Cycladic islands—by yacht or ferry. There are 20 different ones, from the popular Mykonos, to those less travelled, such as Folegandros, Los and more.

## BORACAY, PHILIPPINES

If it's a celebration vacation closer to home that you're after, then plan for a trip to Boracay. The Filipino resort island has all the charm and features of Southeast Asia's more popular island holiday spots—think Bali or Krabi—but with far fewer crowds. Plus, its pristine white sand beaches have been consistently lauded by titles such as *Condé Nast Traveller* and *Travel + Leisure*.

Beaches are not all Boracay has to offer. There are myriad water and adventure activities visitors can enjoy, and make great additions to any birthday celebration or pre-wedding itinerary. Helmet diving, for example, is a fun way to experience Boracay's clear waters and marine life without needing a formal PADI diving certificate. 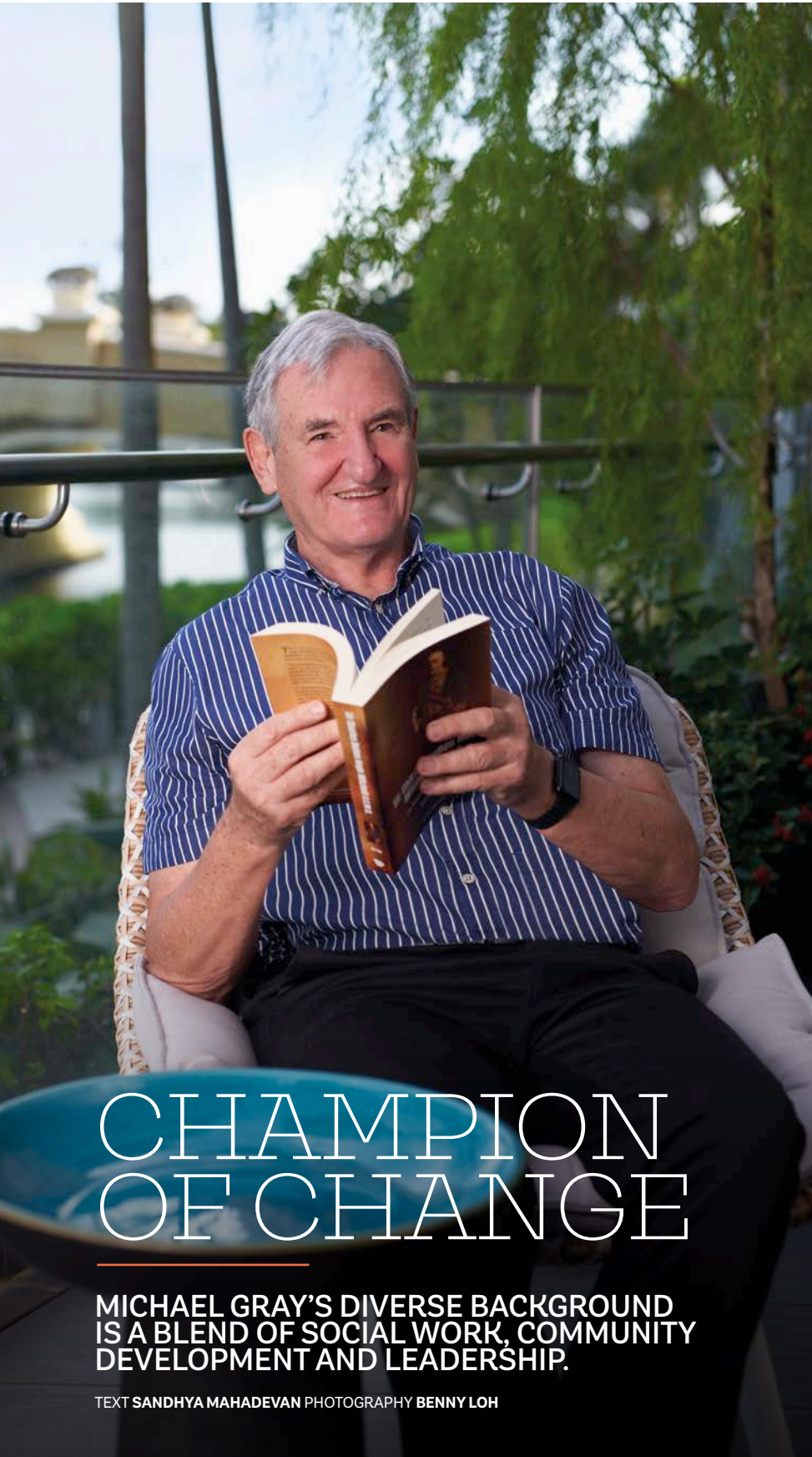

“A man who dares to waste one hour of time has not discovered the value of life.” Charles Darwin, considered the father of evolution, said these words.

British-born Singaporean Michael Gray is a living, breathing example of a man who likes to make every minute of his life count. The former seaman has, for more than four decades, not just served as independent director and chairman of the audit committees of multiple companies, he has dedicated his life to building Singapore’s social service sector. Although retired for the past 20 years, the octogenarian continues to serve on the board of a few charities and social service organisations.

### LIFE EXTRAORDINARY

He was born Michael Grenville Gray in Leeds, England—his mother was an archaeologist and his father worked in the tannery business. His early years were spent in a small hamlet not far from the sea called Downton—“a small Roman village but no *Downton Abbey* there”, he quickly clarifies. A career at sea seemed an obvious choice, having spent a good part of his childhood sailing with his father on his boat. At the age of 16, he took to a career at sea on cargo ships, travelling many times around the world, before moving on to larger cruise ships. He acquired a few certifications along the way, including his Second and First Mate’s, as well as a BSc in Maritime Studies from University of Plymouth.

A chance meeting with Linda, a Malaysian-Chinese student of art at Plymouth, changed his life in more ways than one. She became his wife—49 years and counting—and mother of his two daughters—and Michael made the decision to switch careers to accounting, having been the treasurer for the student’s union at university.

“My seafaring days were an interesting time in my life, but things were not the same as for seafarers nowadays. The ships were different—there were no computers or calculators, we had to navigate by sextant when off shore and magnetic compass close to shore,” explains Michael. “We also had to deal with some of the roughest British crewmen you could imagine. It was a bit dangerous and not an easy life, especially if you were married.”

It’s not often that such a drastic career pivot turns out successfully, but Michael’s accounting career spanned some of the biggest auditing firms—Coopers & Lybrand and later at the merged firm of PricewaterhouseCoopers, among others. He did have a bit of a rough start. He had applied to over 40 chartered accountant firms and was rejected. It was either that he didn’t have the right qualifications

# CHAMPION OF CHANGE

or “I was much older than the type of person they took in those days”. But that changed once Michael took his Chartered Accountant exams in 1977.

“I think I have been very fortuitous in my life, but I also had to work very hard. I am not one of those *inteligencias*,” says Michael. “I was married and I had a child to support—I had to study hard. I knew I had to pass.” And pass he did, at first attempt.

## FINDING HOMETOWN

Michael’s life as a seafarer and later as an auditor has taken him across the seas and to many countries in the West and around Southeast Asia, and as chair to a number of top delegations. “One of the trade delegations I led to Cambodia almost 25 years ago had Arthur Tay [the Club’s CEO and Chairman] as one of the participants,” he muses. But his heart was captured and continues to belong to Singapore. “It’s one of the best decisions I made,” he says of becoming a citizen.

Michael obtained his Singapore citizenship about 30 years ago, but he had moved here with his family back in 1978. He has more insider stories to tell than most others born here—his experiences with Singapore’s pioneer generation as well as the people who made up the country’s social and communal fabric warrant a chapter of its own.

“I have worked with a lot of politicians in Singapore—I was on the Government Parliamentary Committee for communications. One of the things that has impressed me is that Singapore politicians are very different to their Western counterparts—they put the people first and think long term.”

One of Michael’s most notable contributions to Singapore is to its social sector. His life as a volunteer started in the mid-1980s when the Community Chest (CS), the philanthropic arm of the Singapore Council of Social Service (SCSS), had just started. He was among eight others who had volunteered to check the budgets for the agencies associated with it. Michael went on to implement a training programme for volunteers, before being appointed to the board of the SCSS (later National Council of Social Service), where he served for 17 years.

It was one council meeting helmed by Dr Ee Peng Liang, CS’ founder, that threw Michael in the centre of it all. Dr Ee announced that the government had decided to move disabled services under SCSS’ purview, so there was the need to set up a committee. “And Mike will chair it”, he had announced. “I was astonished. I told him that I had never even seen a disabled person. But all he said was ‘okay, then you have one month to learn all about it and you will hold your first meeting’,” recalls Michael.

With him chairing the committee, they put together a disability plan and presented it to the Advisory Council on the Disabled. The report that emerged from it and the projects they implemented would change the entire landscape of disabled people in Singapore—from better accessibility, equal

education opportunities, housing and employment opportunities, to complete integration into society.

Michael was also the founding President of *Pave* for 23 years, which is involved in domestic violence; and with the Ang Mo Kio Family Service Centre for 38 years, eventually becoming its chairman. Michael’s charisma made him the point person at fundraisers—Dr Vivian Balakrishnan, then advisor to Ulu Pandan Citizen Consultative Committee, called him his “secret weapon” as he could bring in the money by just saying a few words of Hokkien.

Michael’s most demanding volunteering stint was as the first Secretary of the Meeting for the Singapore Grand Prix—more so, because he had just expected to be either an usher or waving a trackside flag. It was challenging, “particularly in the first year of 2008 as we only had six months to learn how to run a F1 race”, he says. In 2012, Michael was awarded the best Secretary of the Meeting for motor sports worldwide—the first of its kind. His secret? “Doing it the Singapore way with proper organisation and SOPs,” he laughs.

These are but some of the voluntary work and organisations filling up his CV, that continue to keep him busy. “It’s a matter of planning your life—instead of sitting back and watching TV all night,” shrugs Michael, when I ask him how he has managed family time with a successful career and a very active volunteering life.

“If you are just going to work and coming home every night, you are missing out in life. You learn so much when you volunteer. I would’ve known nothing about disability and what can be done about it, or social services.” A lot has changed in these sectors, but the work is not over yet, he adds.

Michael also manages to indulge in his first love—the sea. His first boating in Singapore was in the late 1970s when Coopers & Lybrand purchased a Grand Banks 32. He was a crew member on part of *Uniquely Singapore’s* Clipper 07-08 Round the World Yacht Race. Michael also had a 25ft Wellcraft, then a 58ft Princess yacht, bought in partnership with three others. The yacht was berthed at ONE°15 Marina Sentosa Cove. Now his 30ft Uttern berths in front of his ground floor apartment in Sentosa Cove. He enjoys taking his boat out with his family to the nearby islands and opening a bottle of wine—his youngest daughter, who shares his love for the water is often the “designated driver” for his drive home.

From being one of the earliest Caucasians in Singapore’s grassroots organisations to one of the few to have been Chairman or Deputy Chairman of a statutory board, Michael’s life has been a seamless assimilation with the country and its culture. Further proof? His Wellcraft boat was named *Blur Sotong* and his current Uttern is *Blur Sotong Two*. 📍

## MICHAEL’S TOP 3

### TRAVEL

We have travelled to many places around the world. We have been to China many times. But my favourite place would be Antarctica. We went out on a small ship to the ice—it was fascinating.

### DISCOVERY

I discovered an island once. I was the Navigation Officer of Union Steam Ship Company of New Zealand, and one night, when on watch from Vavau to Nukualofa in Tonga, I spotted something that looked like a ship on fire. But when we sailed up close, we realised it was a volcano that had come out of the sea. It came up twice after that and eventually sank after about nine months. I suggested it be called Gray Island as I had discovered it but the idea did not go down well.

### BOOKS

I recently authored a book on a former colonial governor and the unspoken legacy he left behind in Singapore *Sir Charles Bullen Hugh Mitchell GCMG 1836 to 1899 — The Forgotten Colonial Governor*. I am currently working on two books on the contributions of Freemasons to Singapore’s history and to my life.



# POSITIVE VIBES ONLY

THE CLUB'S OPERATIONS DIRECTOR'S LIFE AND CAREER HAVE BEEN A JOURNEY OF VALUABLE LIFE LESSONS AND A STRONG BELIEF IN THE POWER OF MANIFESTATION.

**K**anna Karmegam, the Club's Operations Director, is less than a year old at the job, but is well on his mission to familiarise himself and also excel in his new surroundings.

Kanna has about 14 years of experience in the hospitality industry, having cut his teeth at a few luxury hotels, including the Park Hotel Group, M Hotel Singapore and Paradox Singapore Merchant Court. This is his first at a member-focused marina club, but the decision to move away from the very corporate and genteel hotel atmosphere was a conscious choice. "I have always liked hospitality," he ventures, adding that it feeds his love for travel, culture and people. But "it came to a point where I do not know what I don't know", he says about the hotel industry with mysterious profundity.

## LAW OF ATTRACTION

The Kanna of today, who is certain of his career direction, is, by his own admission, a far cry from his younger days. "I didn't know what to do with my life—as most of us. So I was doing all kinds of odd jobs," he laughs. This included being a fish deliveryman for supermarkets and a stint with Cisco. It was at the latter that he realised that he was far from the career of his dreams—a fire that was ignited by the complacent contentment of his colleagues.

"The late Abdul Kalam, Indian aerospace scientist, statesman and former President, once said: 'A dream is not that which you see while sleeping. It is something that does not let you sleep.' It really spoke to me," adds Kanna.

He toyed with the idea of opening a bar with his friend in search of that dream, but decided to gain a degree first on his brother's advice. As the entrepreneurial venture didn't sit well in the young graduate's list of "calculated risks", Kanna jumped



head-on into his hospitality career, beginning with Park Hotel Clarke Quay. He quickly moved up the ranks within the hotel and others—from a bellman as a trainee, to Head of Department, to Director of Rooms, to his current role at the Club.

Kanna stepped foot into ONE°15 Marina Sentosa Cove for the first time in 2016 to attend his friend's wedding. "I was at level three, and I recall looking around and thinking that the place was really 'next level'—whoever owns this place was doing an amazing job," he says. "I had no idea then that I would be working here."

It wasn't, however, purely happenstance; he willed it, through positive thinking. Looking back, he realises that it has always worked for him—for instance, as a trainee at Park Hotel Clarke Quay, he longed to work in the CBD and found himself soon transferring to Grand Park City Hall. "I am a great believer in the law of attraction; I believe that when the thing you desire is at the back of your mind, it materialises whether you consciously act on it or not," he explains. "It has always worked like that for me. I was just thinking that hotel life was becoming monotonous and then a career at the Club opened up for me."

### POSITIVE MINDSET

Kanna credits his father for his attitude and ability to see the positive side of a bad situation. He recalls several incidents from his childhood when his father openly embraced life's adversities and turned them into learning opportunities for Kanna and his brother. "How those incidents play into me right now is the way I look at challenges. I believe there is no challenge or problem that cannot be solved. It all depends on how you approach it. That is my endgame."

This mindset has helped him tremendously throughout his hospitality career, especially when resolving guests' issues. He makes it a point to always hear the guest out, rather than rush to quell the discontentment. This chat over coffee, lunch or even a beer invariably ends with Kanna learning more about the guest and their realisation that the issue was more of a concern than a complaint.

"All that guests want is to be seen and heard," says Kanna and that is the mantra he works

by for Members as well. "I always tell my front desk personnel that whenever a Member or guest approaches them to drop whatever they are doing and look the Member in the eye and first ask how they are doing. It's a simple gesture but makes a big difference."

### LEAD BY EXAMPLE

Kanna also believes that his varied early work experiences—pre-hospitality—exposed him to people of different cultures and backgrounds, and have helped ground him, making him the team leader that he is today.

He recalls another valuable lesson the bell captain at Park Hotel Clarke Quay imparted to him as a trainee. "Here I was a sprightly graduate ready to take on the world, but he put me in my place. He said: 'You're a trainee right now, and you are listening to me. One day, you could become my boss, but it's not until the time that I willfully listen to you that you will become a leader.'"

Kanna takes that to heart, more so in a Club atmosphere to ensure he is relatable to Members of all cultures and boaters equally. Being in charge of six departments—including ONE°15 Charters Luxury Yachting, which is a new domain for him—he walks the talk with his team, and is ever ready to learn.

"In Singlish, they call it *beng suay* (luck or misfortune), but every place I go to, something will happen that has never happened before, which strengthens my learning curve," he explains. At the Club, it was the unfortunate oil spill, which put Kanna front and centre of new modes of operations—and terminology. "I learnt about booms and their role in the cleanup of oil spills for the first time", among other things being out on the boat with Marina Operations Manager Mohammad Tasrin.

Despite working in a marina, Kanna admits to not being much of a water person. He is more of a roadster. "I have always loved motorbikes and cars since I was a kid. Rather, their engines fascinated me. I used to love to disassemble a motorbike engine and put it back," he says, although cars are a different ball game. Road trips with his childhood buddies and drives along lonely roads are his indulgences.

He does not dismiss the probability of that love turning towards the water. He has had his share of "firsts" at the Club, including the opportunity to work in a company where the owners were down to earth. "It would never be so in a hotel environment," he says, with palpable admiration.

All things considered, a career at the Club may well be the realisation of a dream that kept him awake at night. 📺

# TASTE OF THE COAST

WHERE THE SEA MEETS PLATE, ICONIC DISHES THAT HAVE BEEN INSPIRED AND PROVIDED BY THE MARINE ENVIRONMENT.

Someone once said, “food is more than sustenance—it is an expression of culture, heritage, and creativity”.

This is especially true in the case of coastal cuisine. As the name suggests, the cuisine may be defined as food that comes from the ocean, but that would be too simple an explanation when you look at it in the context of communities as a whole. It is more a tapestry threaded with all the aforementioned and tied with what the sea provides.

Delving deeper, coastal cuisine can be said to originate from how the indigenous population lived, their method of food procurement—their fishing processes and the harmony they enjoyed with the marine environment. This included incorporation of vegetation that grew along the shoreline and locally available. Over time, with the introduction of spices and other regional influences, coastal cuisine has evolved, but remains largely true to its original essence. Here are some of the popular dishes.

## Sushi

Think Japan and its iconic raw fish delicacy wrapped over vinegared rice comes to mind—albeit that the combination of rice and fermented fish began humbly as a means of preservation. The name sushi means “sour fish” in Japanese. It is believed that this method of preservation was adopted from Southeast Asian cultures, especially those along the Mekong Delta. It was only during the Edo Period (1603 to 1868) that sushi as a dish became popular. Fermented fish was replaced with freshly caught fish, which was still marinated and preserved with salt, and sauces and seasonings. The modern-day hand-pressed version or nigiri sushi comes with freshly caught gizzard shad, lean tuna, saltwater eel or mackerel placed atop a ball of rice. Makizushi or sushi rolls version—fish and rice, and some pieces of vegetable rolled in seaweed—is probably the more popular one, while sashimi elevates the dish to its highest form.

Japanese sushi is so intertwined with the culinary heritage of the country that it is almost treated as an art form—it’s about the quality of the ingredients, consistency, mode of cooking, the temperature it is served in as well as how it is placed on the plate. The



vinegared rice is mixed in a *bandai* (wooden rice containers)—the bottom is wetted slightly so the rice does not stick. Freshly cooked rice is added and sushi vinegar is sprinkled evenly over it, then, using a *shamoji* (wooden ladle), held horizontally, the rice is mixed and the clumps separated as if it were being whisked, a few grains at a time. The process is repeated twice till individual grains are shiny with the coating of vinegar. It is then cooled to 40 to 45 degrees before serving with a slice of seafood.

### FUN FACT

Chef Jiro Ono, the world’s numero uno sushi master—now retired—is credited with elevating sushi to an art form. It extended to how he served them—he positioned the sushi pieces differently depending on whether the customer was left- or right-handed. He also made the sushi pieces slightly smaller for the women so that both the men and women could finish eating the food at the same time.





## Ceviche

A Peruvian delicacy, which has gained prominence all along the Pacific Coast and beyond. The dish involves raw fish marinated in lime juice, which in turn cooks it. It is believed that the concept of cooking fish in citric acid originated nearly 2,000 years ago, employed by the Moche civilisation, who inhabited the area. They prepared their fish with the juice of banana passionfruit, a local variety called *tumbo*, which grows abundantly in the Andean valleys—extending from Venezuela to Peru and Bolivia. It is believed that the Incas after them adopted the dish but used an Andean fermented corn beverage called *chicha* for the marination.

The ceviche as it is prepared today was a result of the arrival of the Spanish to the region—they imported lime, orange and coriander leaves among others from the Mediterranean. The dish has since spread across South America, with each adding their twist—with fruits, vegetables and even roasted peanuts as in Ecuador, and a splash of coconut milk in the Caribbean.

Although fish is considered the most authentic form, shrimp, scallops and squid have since made it to the dish. In Peru, it is served with a variety of accompaniments—from sweet potato to toasted corn and even rice.

### FUN FACT

The role of ceviche in Peruvian culinary heritage is unmistakable. Día del Ceviche, celebrated in Peru on June 28 is an annual celebration in honour of this dish.



## Malabar Mathi Curry

The name of this Indian dish is indicative of the region—the Malabar coast in the country's southwestern region, which covers a small portion of the states of Karnataka and most of Kerala. A staple of the latter, Malabar Mathi Curry is a celebration of its way of life, which is entwined with fishing. Sardine, called *mathi* in Malayalam, the native tongue of Kerala, is the hero of this dish and gives it its name. The fish is semi-stewed in coconut milk, made from fresh coconuts, which are abundant in the region. Other ingredients and spices that are synonymous with Indian cuisine include onion, tomatoes, red chilli, tamarind, garlic, ginger, and curry and coriander leaves, making this a wholesome curry.

Oil sardines used to swim exclusively around the Malabar Coast as well as Goa, making them an easy

catch, affordable as well as highly nutritious. The dish is equally popular in Goa with a slight variation—the use of powdered spices and exclusion of curry leaves. Due to global warming, the sardine population has since begun moving to cooler waters along the East and Northeastern parts of India—where the fish is not part of the culinary culture. Malabar Mathi Curry (or just Malabar Fish Curry) has evolved to include other varieties, such as seer, sea bass, and tilapia.

### FUN FACT

Sardines are known to be packed with nutrients and omega-3 fatty acids. Not just healthy for humans, they play a role in maintaining a balanced marine ecosystem—thanks to their small size, they are prey for larger fish, birds, and mammals.

## Chilli Crab

Singapore is a haven for seafood among other culinary delights, thanks to its maritime history. When it comes to quintessential coastal food though, the Chilli Crab—deep-fried mud crabs in tomato and chilli gravy—is iconic to the island-state. In fact, the Singapore Tourism Board promotes it as one of Singapore’s signature dishes.

The dish dates back to the mid-1950s when humble coastal pushcart vendor Cher Yam Tian stumbled upon a new way to serve the stir-fried crabs that she and her husband Lim Choo Ngee were selling—she added tangy tomato sauce to the dish. The couple later opened Palm Beach Seafood

restaurant, a Singapore icon, although it has since closed as the couple migrated to New Zealand.

Tian’s recipe used bottled chilli sauce but the dish has since evolved. Chef and restaurateur Hooi Kok Wah’s version, which he served in his restaurant Dragon Phoenix Restaurant (opened in 1963), replaced the canned or bottled sauce with a delightful paste comprising sambal and tomato paste, lemon juice, vinegar, and egg-white, rendering a slightly sour taste to the dish. This is how the dish is made today in Singapore.

### FUN FACT

Singapore’s Chilli Crab dish is more than a national icon—it was listed as one of the “world’s 50 most delicious foods” by *CNN Go* in 2011.





## Clam Chowder

A creamy stew made of clams, salted pork, potatoes and onions, clam chowder—synonymous with the New England region of the United States—is a perfect example of a dish arising from the needs of seaside dwellers. And it is said to have originated at the very place that it is celebrated to this day, when French soldiers crashed onto the coast of Maine, the northernmost state of the US, in the 17<sup>th</sup> century. The soldiers were low on supplies so they improvised with what the land provided. The local waters abounded with clams, which they combined with ingredients available nearby—milk and butter from the cows they reared, potatoes and onions from the garden. Later iterations have seen more vegetables being added to the dish, and chefs have added their twist. MasterChef judge John Torode’s recipe clubs clams with smoked and white fish fillets, cream, milk and butter as well as white wine, elevating the comfort food to the level of fine cuisine.

The first time the dish featured in a restaurant menu was in 1836 at the Union Oyster House in Boston—it grew to become a favourite of the late President John F Kennedy. To date, his favourite booth in the restaurant stands as a memorial. 📍

### FUN FACT

The name “chowder” is believed to have come from the French word for cooking pot or cauldron: *chaudière*. Another version, perhaps a more lighthearted one, claims that it comes from the old English word jowter or “fish peddler”.
